The only thing I would add to the great advice already given is I much prefer a clear intermediate line for the surf. The surf in the Atlantic even on a calm day will toss your floating line around too much. In addition, the most valuable tool you can bring with you is a good stripping basket. Otherwise you will spend most of your time trying to untangle and retrieve your fly line.

Oh yeah... one more thing.... Tidal movement is everything. If you are fishing a slack tide you are basically practicing your cast. Try and hit a either a rising or falling tide. I just bought a great tide app for my iphone which I absolutely love called Tide Graph. It will give you the exact tidal stats to your exact location wherever you are.

Good luck and tight lines! Watch out for joggers on your back cast, I caught one on her shorts once... I felt terrible and she almost ended up with her shorts around her ankles!
