I have been tying less than a year and I could tie all of them. I don't think there was a need to have photos and tying directions for Walts Worm, Green Weenies and Zebra Midges. If there were original flys in there that Eric developed that would be one thing, but I wish instead he would have covered more flies, the proper utilization, tips for fishing them, etc.

The chapter on line control and rod position were short, sweet and have huge take away value. Very good stuff that may or may not be intuitive to some but an asset to all.
