Maccaffertium genus (cahills and March Browns)

Baetis genus (all of which are called BWO's, but not all BWO's are Baetis)

Isonychia genus (Slate Drakes)

Hexagenia (Hex's)

There was a time when I thought ALL mayfly nymphs had 3 tails. But it's not so. For instance, the Epeorus genus has only 2 tails in the nymph stage. That genus includes Quill Gordons and Little Maryatts.
