What I do first is to sit and just study the stream. Look for feeding fish, then I would walk 10'-20' from the water, looking for fish and then casting upstream so your nymph, streamer or dry drifts by him. The most important thing to remember is as natural a drift as possible, you want no drag so mending upstream is very important. If the fish don't bite what your using after 10 or 20 minutes change out your fly. Don't be discouraged. Fish like that are very weary, that's how they got to be so big. Also, just after a rain or even during a rain if it isn't to hard, fishing terestreats is very good and the rain will make the surface harder for the fish to see you
