I have not read the book in question, but of the many Meck books I've seen, **the handbook of PA hatches he did in collaboration with Paul Weamer is the one I think would be most helpful to you. It covers mayflies, caddisflies, stoneflies, and others.** However, if you can find Ted Fauceglia's coffee table style book "Mayflies," I think it is a lot better, tho it does not discuss downwing flies. You ought to be able to find either of these in any fly shop or in many bookstores. If you have a significant other, perhaps you could suggest these books as Christmas gifts for you.
