I swing for steelies if conditions are good for it. like said above, slightly higher water. no need for a special rod or anything, and you can swing lots of different flies, not just traditional wets, in fact, those big and loud northwest steelie flies might not work on our stupid hatchery steelies, heck, last week I had some takes on egg patterns I left hang at the end of a drift.

swinging wets will also work on smaller streams, I swing wets on brookie streams all the time, usually working my way back downstream after using dry flies upstream, casting down and across riffle areas, it's surprising where you'll find fish using that method.
