Welcome to PAFF and our online community.

The phenomenon of brown trout (often large ones) being caught in larger rivers associated with warm water species occurs pretty much statewide. There are seasonally transient population of brown trout in most large rivers that have trout upriver, or cold water tribs and these fish can often move many miles as waters warm in spring or cool in the fall. However, these big river brown trout - in my experience - are sparse and a difficult fishery, esp for fly fishers as the fish move so much and aren't always in predictable areas. Anyway, with that said, if you're jazzed to go get 'em, I'd talk to some of the walleye guys and see if they'll give you some intel on where these fish are in the river.....then I'd target them with a large streamer fished low and slow with a sink tip line. Mid day with cloudy skies and a warming trend would probably be best.
