Mike,

with the recent explosion in the white perch pops that I have been hearing about, some stripers would help keep the lake diversified.

Judging by the size of the musky's I've seen come out of the lake, I'm sure they don't have too much competition.

I mean I find it kind of funny how they tossed a bunch in Pinchot years back, Pinchot is mostly less than 10-15 feet deep throughout the lake.

Marburg is deeper than that within casting distance from the shore. The map I own says it is 110 ft. at the dam and mostly deeper than. 40 ft. deep just a short distance offshore anywhere downlake from the first bridge. The main body of water from the two islands (Long Island & Round Island) down to the dam is mostly between 60-80 ft. in depth. There is a LOT of deep, cold, clear water in Marburg.

Marburg has a definite thermocline with adequate oxygen levels for coldwater species.

Don't know if you remember, back in the 90's they dumped like 17'000 or so coho salmon in Marburg and they were in there for years.
