With the water temps and algae blooms of the last jams I'm thinking the month of June will be a better time frame for a WW jam .

I don't remember algae blooms during the last two WW jams - the NB Susky last year was clear (although very windy and late day thunderstorm). The Juniata River in 2010 was crystal clear.

Nevertheless, a different time of year than late summer might be worthwhile.....it's just hard with timing.

We have the main jam in May, trico jam in summer, Delaware Jam in Sept, salt and Erie jams in November.

Maybe October this year? June would work too but, in my experience, this is a tough month to catch river bass (although a good muskie and panfish month).

I agree with FI above. Late summer - early fall has always been the best fishing for river smallies in PA. They spawn in May through mid-June and post spawn catching is usually tough. Again, in the past, the low water periods in late July and August were always prime time, but things have been bass ackwords the last few years. Maybe a late June WW Jam will change our luck.
