I fly fished the Yellow Breeches today from 2pm until 5pm. Air temp low 40's and the creek was up a bit (I didn't take a water temp), but still nice and clear.

I fished the Run and downstream to the dam. This was my first time fly fishing for trout in over a month. My new waders arrived yesterday, and I must say that I was dry and comfy!

A few midges were happening, and some trout were rising for them. The guy fishing next to me said he was using size 30 midges (dry parachute and droppers) but the trout just wouldn't hit his flies. He said a size 50 would be about right! LOL

I landed 3 and rolled another 3. High Sticking with a heavy nymph was the only thing that worked for me today. I caught everything on a tungsten realistic stonefly nymph, size 14. Slow and deep on the bottom I tried tiny Zebras under a indicator, and slow streamers - not even a touch!

Yellow Breeches was just stocked last week, and there are dozens of trout in every pool. I saw a awful lot of small suckers also.

It was so much fun to go out trout fishing again. I'm so sick of talkin' politics and soul music on the OT forum. Only six days until March!!

PS - Spin fishing is still allowed in the C&R with metal, plastic, and rubber (that includes almost everything) but I didn't see any spin guys today!

CATCH AND RELEASE AREA

SPECIAL REGULATIONS APPLY

1. Fishing may be done with artificial lures only constructed of metal, plastic, rubber, or wood or with flies or streamers constructed of natural or synthetic materials. Lures may be used with spinning or fly-fishing gear.
 2. The use or possession of any natural bait, baitfish, fishbait, bait paste and similar substances, fish eggs (natural or molded) or any other edible substance is prohibited.
 3. Fishing hours are one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset.
 4. No trout may be killed or had in possession.
- Fishing year-round; there is no closed season.
