Most streams, particularly bigger ones, or ones with considerable local value (which describes many of the streams we discuss on this forum).....have a "conservation plan" or watershed management plan and most of these are posted online. I've spent a lot of time reading them the last couple years. Oftentimes, there is very good (if you can tolerate scientific jargon) info about local land use, pollution, macros, etc. Some of these plans also have good data on fish populations that are a result of DEP or PFBC surveys. Conservation plans are a wealth of info.
