Also the \$50 fees from other companies might as well be a repair charge - to me a warranty doesn't have an associated cost.

Handling fee? come on.

Many warranties have a deductible. I like the way St Croix handles repairs. If it failed due to their fault no charge. If you broke it, didn't register it, not original owner, etc you pay a very reasonable fee. If you broke it and want to trade up you can do that too, paying the difference plus repair fee.

Again, their defect should be no charge. Your fault, \$50 is very reasonable to find replacement, proper fitting sections, hand paint serial numbers, ship and buy \$750 worth of insurance.
