You may get away with fishing downstream in the Park where it's a little wider, although I doubt it. No way in the sections I fish where, at its widest, it's about twenty feet. You'll spook fish within a mile. You fish nymphs downstream? The trick to nymphing is getting them deep and fast. How do you that downstream?

I catch 90% of my fish at Valley fishing downstream. I stay low and am fishing fast water if using this tactic. Given this fast water and that these areas are typically shallow as well, we're talking about fish with a small, distorted window.

Plus, my experience at VC contradicts the whole "Valley trout are so spooky" claims. Those fish see people constantly (both in and out of the park). I find them to be particularly tolerant to anglers. I can't count the amount of times I've stood over fish I know can see me, only to have them completely ignore me and go about their business. These trout are the rule at VC, not the exception, in my experience.
