The 4th one, is it in a waterway that's stocked? The fins aren't crisp, but the wild ain't a perfect place to live!

The fourth fish is from Lancaster County. They don't typically stock brookies here, although that doesn't preclude an errant stray getting mixed in with the browns and rainbows, or a co-op from dumping some in. And one year, I know that the WCO gave a "special" allocation of brookies to Little Beaver Creek (of all places). Regardless, of the source, it is not from a stocked trout stream. There are no ATW that flow into the stream either. The only other fish I've ever caught in the stream are wild browns. I thought it was a large chub when I brought it in, because it definitely did not have yellow fins 🙄 Could be the penultimate brookie migrator pisces..
