I'dk Tulenkot's could be over 13. But that is definitely a super rare fish in PA. Biggest I've seen may have hit 13, I hooked and lost that one.

Also none of my 10"+ brookies took dry flies. I'm sure they do in some cases but it's much easier to get them subsurface, since they tend to be living in the deepest pools on the stream.

And one more thing. I think you have a better chance at 10"+ natives in the SE part of the state due to longer "growing season", the hard part there is finding streams with native brook trout and then finding access. In the NC/NE region the hard part is finding a brookie stream that can produce a 10" fish. So many of the small streams have brook trout it can take a while to find the best streams. just a theory of mine, not even proven by myself yet.

FWIW here's my best, caught last month. Didn't get a great picture. 12-12.5"
