Fishing on the Middle continues to be pretty darn good. This last weekend, though, seemed to indicate that the river is making the turn into summer mode as the mid-day slow down (or death of fishing depending upon light level) and transition into summer hatches is happening now.

There are still fishable numbers of cahills and sulfurs in the evening, and perhaps a few march brown spinners and coffin flies around, but from here on out they will be fewer in number and morning caddis and crane flies, followed by afternoon bwos and isos will be the daily menu. Do not despair, however, because all this means is that predictable fishing will continue to these bugs throughout the remainder of the season. Other summer side dishes, of course, will get some fish as well.

What this really means though, for those of us who keep to the maxim, everything to its season, is that the smallmouth season has arrived. And with the increased number of warm-water skippers and boats in our lineup this season, we have plenty of availability for those who are looking for a day of unadulterated fun chasing anything from bass, to carp, to musky down low on the river.
