I'll leave the salt and WW stuff to people who are more familiar with it than I.

You will predate fall stockings, so in the trout world, you're confined to wild trout streams. If you wanted to stay under an hour, there's a couple of options but it's slim pickings. Once you get into the hour and a half range, you can get into the mountains and options open up considerably, but it'll be mostly smaller and medium sized streams.

3-4 hours, and well, you can get to the best PA has to offer, including our larger and fairly famous limestoners, a few big tailwaters, etc.

I can help with PM's if you haven't gotten enough already. But mostly I guess I'd ask what kind of fishing you'd want to get into. There's smallmouth, saltwater, etc. And among trout, there's large tailwaters, medium to large limestoners, small to medium freestoners. And within that, you can get a relatively easy, park and fish type place, pastoral settings, deep woods/mountain settings with hikes, etc. Streams ranging from ultra-low gradient, classic limestoners with tricky, weedy currents to high gradient with waterfalls and the like.
