You seem to have made the mistake of believing that fish exist for your pleasure and that landowners should also open their land for your pleasure. Rather, look at it as a blessing that some fish allow themselves to be caught and that some land is open to the public. Also consider that private land provides some amount of protection for the fish.

I don't agree that most of the Class A is off limits, statewide or Bucks County only (where 3 of 4 streams are listed as almost 100% private open). Further, just because the list says one thing doesn't mean you still can't ask permission (and just because a section is listed as open also doesn't mean that it hasn't closed since then).
