See above, where I added an edit to clarify the confusion you're undergoing as you break away from the AFTMA designations created after your rod was made.

And no, a DT is not like an WF line one weight heavier. They're the same thing to 30' back, at which point the DT line continues to have the same diameter, and the WF line falls down. Only over 30' are you overlining the rod to something bigger.

Prior to that 30' limit, a 4wt line is 4wt line, regardless of its taper designation. That's the beauty of the system. Its 120 +/-6 grains. Always. All day long.

Now, as noted in another thread, if it feels great to you at that line designation, then wonderful. You've proven what you like, and that's the only answer.
