the only reason it would unwind is if you wrap the thread from the 'whips' where they dont cover the tag (bobbin) end of the thread.

Think of it like this - take your bobbin in your non tying hand, get your whip finish tool and form the first loop over the hook, now hold the bobbin taught at, and toward the back of the hook, take 4-5 more wraps back toward the back of the hook **over the thread from which is coming out of the bobbin** - these over wraps are what lock the thread in place.

If you go the other way, not wrapping over the tag (bobbin) end of the thread, the whip finish will just unravel.
