IMO, the advantages of a 90\* angle rig as described above are nullified by the fact that it can't be adjusted to the proper depth. To fish effectively, most of the time, you need to be very close to the bottom.

Especially in the cold water of winter, it is a rare occurrence for a fish to be suspended above the bottom while feeding, or for a fish to move any great distance from it's holding position to feed, therefore a rig that can be adjusted to ride inches from the bottom of the stream is essential.

the bobber is just looped thru its hole. You can slide it up or down anytime you want very easily. I moved it 3 or 4 times until I found the right depth the day I used it. Even with the climbing knot technique, you can slide it up and down the leader very easily to any depth you want.
