One trick about wet fly wings that some people use is to hold the wings with the thumb and middle finger, rather than thumb and index finger -- it helps to keep the wings parallel to the hook shank.

I totally agree about natural dubbing to easier to make a noodle with than synthetics. (There are exceptions, of course. Seal isn't particularly easy to dub.) Mixing a bit of natural dubbing into synthetic can make it easier.
