I also upgraded to a Renzetti travelers vise and cann't say enough good things about it. I have a two volume set of loose leaf tying manuals from Orvis from God knows when. In the back of the one is a set of instuctions and some flies to tie that will get you familiar with all the different techniques. Yoiu can visit youtube.com and check for videos on how to use things like whip finnishers and other tools. The videos make more sense than any written instructions I have seen and are free.
